Frank Fish began his business career managing concerts and events for Ambassador Auditorium, a Southern California premier concert venue. Personally he has hosted cruises and planned and escorted major tours for churches, college & high school music ensembles and community groups to the People's Republic of China, Japan, Italy, England, Scotland, Slovenia, Austria, Russia, Israel, Turkey, Costa Rica, Croatia, Slovenia, Greece, Egypt, Thailand, and various countries in Africa. Charlie Brodie was a high school band director for 35 years – first at Hanover High School in Hanover, Pa (16 years) and then at Woodward Academy in Atlanta, GA (19 years). During this time his bands consistently received superior ratings in concert, jazz and marching settings, performed at state music conferences, received numerous awards (including Bands of America Regional and National championships), appeared on national television, and toured extensively – both domestically and internationally.

Since 2002, Charlie has served as our Music Director Liaison and in addition to coordinating travel for bands to the Pasadena Rose Parade, The Midwest Clinic, and numerous other domestic destinations, Charlie has also arranged international performance tours to Australia, China, Central America and Europe.
